● ● ● WATER STORAGE TANK PROJECT

The Town was awarded a WIFA Grant in January for the Mountain Meadow Water Storage Tank Project. No responses were received on the Invitation to Bid Staff for a Corrugated Steel Tank. Therefore, in the hopes of receiving better responses from the Manufacturers and Contractors, Staff modified the plans and changed the tank style to a Bolt Tank. This project will be bid once the Engineer has completed their review.


DUCK RELOCATION
