TOP OF THE WOODS

The West Channel walls were poured and finished the first week of June and the pond is 80% complete. The remaining dirt in the pond will be used to build the access road. The Team has a vault and two culverts left to install (going across Pine Village), by which time all culverts will be complete. The retention pond is dug, and the culvert has been installed that feeds the pond. Although there is much more work yet to do, it is looking good!

IMPROVEMENTS

Progress is happening! The detour is expected to be taken done on June 7th, and then the paving will start. The light pole conduit is be installed and rough grading is nearly complete on the entire length of the walking path. Operations Manager, Daniel Rawlings stated that Perkins has done a fantastic job thus far; Perkins is keeping the Team well informed of their progress as well as working with the Town making necessary field adjustments.


MOUNTAIN MEADOWS

- Pedestrians: 4 fatal and 6 serious injury crashes
- Bicyclists: 0 fatal and 1 serious injury crashes
- Lighting: 4 crashes occurred in daylight, 5 in dark, and 2 unknown
- Crash Location:
 - 3 non-intersection
 - 1 intersection
 - 7 unknown

Potential Countermeasures

- Install lighting on both side from MP 349-355
- Enhance signal operations for pedestrians and bicyclists
